- Dig trenches when pipes need to be laid beneath the earth, and cover the pipes once they are in place with dirt or other similar material
- Install or repair sanitary sewer structures or stormwater pipe systems
- Follow written instructions and blueprints to coordinate and lay out pipe routes
- Use tamping machines or hand tools to grade or level trench bases
- Train other pipelayers in the process and subordinates to ensure they can execute the work and abide by company policies.
